Grace, mercy and peace to you in Christ Jesus, God Incarnate!

Who spake by the Prophets. (Nicene Creed) onfessing that the Holy Spirit spake by the Prophets," the Church simply repeat what Holy Scripture teaches. As St. Peter wrote in his Second Epistle: "for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit." (1:21) And our Lord clearly teaches that this work of the Holy Spirit was certainly not limited to the Old Testament. Jesus told His disciples: "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all the things that I said to you." (John 14:26) Again, "But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me. And you also will bear witness, because you have been with Me from the beginning." (John 15:26–27)

Thus St. Paul teaches, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God..." (1 Tim. 3:16). Indeed, the Holy Spirit inspired St. Paul to so write to the Church! *All* Scripture is given by inspiration—what a blessing we have in knowing that the Holy Trinity has given us a sure Word of revelation!

We are blessed to live in this late age of the earth, for we read in Hebrews 1: "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds;" (v. 1-2). The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and the Holy Spirit guided Christ's disciples to faithfully record the written Word so that we would hear all that Christ would have us to hear.

The pastors of the five independent parishes were able to sign a joint statement which reflects this agreement, and this statement will be given to the congregational voters assemblies for affirmation.

received from the members of Salem! The generous support which you offered them—including food and offers of housing during the conference—helped them know how welcome they truly were.

Approximately 40–45 will be invited for the next conference, which is tentatively scheduled for January (and which will be hosted by another parish). ## Church gains members and worship space First service at new church set for Aug. 1

Concordia Evangelical Lutheran Church started out in December meeting in its members' homes and in February rented space to hold services in West Visalia Grange Hall.

The fledgling church, which started out with seven families and now has nearly 50 members, is making another move to an actual church building, sharing space with Visalia's Community of Christ Church at 2127 S. Giddings Ave.

Concordia was formed by former members of Visalia's Grace Lutheran Church who decided to strike out on their own over issues of worship practices and religious doctrine.

Clark Brown, Concordia's pastor, said Community of Christ leaders approached members of his congregation with the offer.

"We do have some friendship ties. Some of our members are friends with some of theirs," he said. "The offer came to share, and it coincided with our desire to have something that looked like a regular worship setting."

Concordia Evangelical will hold its first service at Community of Christ at 10:45 a.m. on Aug. 1, Brown said, adding that Bible studies, confirmation classes and some special services also will be held there during the week.

In exchange for the use of the church, Brown said, Concordia will pay rent—"It's considerably more than we paid at the Grange Hall"—and members of his congregation will help out with groundskeeping and building maintenance.

As for sharing a church belonging to a denomination "whose theology we don't recognize," Brown said he researched whether accepting the offer would violate his church's practices.

He summed up his conclusion in a Bible verse: "Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, as Christ says, there I am in there midst," which he summed up as, wherever his congregation gathers to worship, "we need not fear who owns the building."
