"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14) The Christ came in great humility to accom-

plish our redemption; His glory was revealed upon the Mount of Transfiguration and following His resurrection. In these penitential days of Advent, the world around us gives itself over to self-indulgence and, frankly, worship of Mammon. We hear that "Jesus is the Reason for the Season," but for many, He's not.

For others, the seduction is more subtle, transforming the Holy Day into a celebration of the family. Certainly there is nothing wrong with family gathering to observe such a day and to join together in the joyous celebration of the birth of our Savior! But it is easy to forget that the day is about something even more important than our earthly families—the Second Person of the Holy Trinity became man so that through Him we receive adoption as sons of the heavenly Father. As you celebrate with family in this holy season, above all please remember that holy family into which you have been adopted through holy Baptism.

The Christian observance of Advent and Christmas is lived in receiving the Christ Child as He comes to us through His Word and His Body and Blood. Christ-Mass draws its name and essence from the Mass celebrated on the Festival of the Nativity; without the Mass (Divine Service), there is no "Christmas." But because of the birth of the Christ Child, we have a Christ-Mass, and the Incarnate Word speaks peace to us, and feeds us with His own body and blood. "This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that one may eat of it and not die." (John 6:50)

December 20th: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Psalm 98; Isaiah 7:10-14; Matthew 1:18-23
